Journey of Medical Education Department, BCPS: Its Contribution in Developing Skilled Fellows for Effective use of Assessment Tools

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Background

BCPS established Medical Education Department (MED) in February, 2017 with the aim to aware the teachers and examiners of the concepts of assessment and thus improving the overall assessment system performed by BCPS. The assessment system of BCPS focuses on the competencies related to knowledge, skills and attitude, which the specialist doctors must have to serve at the community level in their clinical context.

Till establishment of Medical Education Department in 2017, the Examination Department of BCPS and Medical Education Cell arranged workshops on assessment tools. The first workshop on 'How to construct OSPE/OSCE station' was arranged by Examination Department on 18-26th October 2010. Side by side, work for developing a question bank for OSPE stated in the same year. Till 2014, the Examination Department arranged workshops on Single Best Answer (SBA) and OSCE. In June 2015, a committee of Medical Education Cell was formed which organized workshops on MCQ, SBA and OSPE which were interactive, practical oriented and

participatory. All the questions constructed in these workshops were handed over to the Examination Department of BCPS for inclusion in the question bank (Table I).

Medical Education Department

Since 2017, following its establishment, Medical Education Department of BCPS, organized many workshops (8:30am-3pm) on MCQ, SBA, OSPE, communication skill, written script assessment, Short answer questions (SAQ), interactive oral examination (IOE) and clinical case assessment. There were trained facilitators in Medical Education in each workshop. In the 2 day workshop, on the first day, short presentation on respective topic were given, following which all participants were divided into small groups to prepare tasks of the topic (MCQ, SBA/ OSPE/Clinical assessment). This was based on the principle of 'Learning by doing'. On the 2nd day each group presented their group work and other groups along with facilitators provided positive and constructive criticism on their works (table II).

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Since January 2019 till April 2022 total 31 workshops trained 1419 Fellows of all specialties (table III). Due to COVID 19 lockdown in 2020 there was a pause in arranging on campus workshops. Workshops resumed from September 2020.

All participants were given certificates after completion of the workshops in presence of Honorable President, BCPS / Honorary Secretary / Chairman, Medical Education Department. All the questions constructed in these workshops were handed over to the Examination Department of BCPS for inclusion in the question bank.

Apart from holding regular committee meetings, the department also organized several meetings with other Departments and faculty members regarding accreditation systems and problems for the college.

A team of 12 members participated in OTTAWA 2020 in

Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. This was the first time Bangladesh organized a complete workshop on 'Effective Feedback on Assessment' in an international medical education conference abroad, which was headed By Prof. Abul Bashar Md. Jamal, Prof. Tahmina Begum, and Prof. ATM Emdadul Haque. The team members also participated 6 other workshops and 2 organized courses (Figure 2).

In 2019 Medical Education Department, BCPS organized a meeting with Prof. Rita Sood, Head of Medicine and Medical Education Department AIIMS while her visit at BCPS to take FCPS Clinical Examination. Dignitaries of BCPS and EC members exchanged their views with the then President of South-East Asian Regional Association for Medical Education (SEARAME).
